
















JOSH HARROP

From growing up at Manchester United to arriving at Cheltenham Town, midfielder Josh Harrop is ready to write the next chapter in his career.

The Englishman became the first January addition to the Robins' ranks a few weeks ago after a successful trial period under the watchful eye of manager Darrell Clarke.

"It's a great opportunity for me and I'm glad to finally get the deal signed," said Harrop upon joining Town.

"I've had a couple of weeks training here to show what I'm about and I feel like I've settled in quite well and got to know the lads and the qaffer has been great with me."

Clarke played a pivotal role in the addition of the former England U20s international to the squad and Harrop now has his sights set on repaying the faith shown in him.

"He wanted me to come in to see how fit I was and to see if I was up to speed," Josh continued.

"I've been working really hard since I've become a free agent and I've come in to show that and he's seen what I'm about and given me the opportunity to sign."

Having spent his time on trial at the club, the midfielder admitted the environment Clarke and his staff have created is exactly what he was looking for in his next club.

"I've trained here now for two weeks and seen the level and it is a good level of training.

"The lads are at it with a real high intensity and that's something I wanted to come into, where everyone is buying into what the manager is doing and I feel like that's what they've got here."

Fellow midfielder Tom Pett also joined the Robins this season after spending time as a free agent and Harrop is proud to have overcome that hurdle.

"It was a difficult period.
I've played football since I
was six years old and it gets
taken away for a little
bit of time.

"It's not easy but you've got to stay motivated and keep training so when your opportunity comes, you're ready to go and I've done that."

The 28-year-old's time in football has had

its highs and lows, with a goal on his Premier League debut for Manchester United a clear highlight.

He's since featured for Preston North End, Ipswich Town, Fleetwood Town and Northampton, where he has forged himself as a creative threat in the heart of the pitch with a skillset suitable for thriving at the top level.

"I can be a number eight, a number 10 or play through the middle. I like to get on the ball, hit the box, score goals and pop up with assists as well."

Josh arrives at a time where the Robins' plight is well-documented with a long and arduous battle for survival ahead of them, but Harrop is ready to be called upon.

"I'm here to give the most for this club, give everything I can and hopefully I can contribute to keeping the club in the league."

From this Saturday new bins for dry mixed recycling (labelled accordingly for metal, plastic, cardboard, paper) will be placed around the ground.



WYCOMBE WANDERERS



They've been promotion contenders in years gone by, but manager Matt Bloomfield now has a very different task on his hands in trying to keep **Wycombe Wanderers in League One.** As February rolls around, the Chairboys find themselves sat in 19th in the third tier of English football. Sixth in the 2021/22 season and ninth in 2022/23 preceded the current campaign after a year spent in the Championship under club legend Gareth Ainsworth. In his shoes stepped Bloomfield, another name written in the club's folklore.

The season kicked off in impressive fashion with six wins from their opening 11 games but the following 17 have only resulted in one more success, that coming against Bristol Rovers on New Year's Day. Consequently, a spot four points above the drop zone is where Wycombe sit, sticking to the rollercoaster nature of the club in the past decade that saw them avoid relegation to non-league on goal difference in 2013/14 before the impressive rebound to the Championship during the Covid-19 pandemic.

Meetings with the Robins have resulted in goal fests of late with the infamous 5-5 draw at Adams Park in 2022 the standout result. Last term saw the Chairboys fall the wrong side of 1-0 and 3-0 scorelines with the latter coming in the early months of Bloomfield's tenure.

One player he will be counting on to avenge that defeat is former Shrewsbury Town man Luke Leahy who has seven goals and six assists to his name in league action this term. Their squad also includes loan striker Dale Taylor, who has four goals to his name, whilst the experienced duo of 34-year-old Sam Vokes and 36-year-old Garath McCleary have also been prolific in the club's goalscoring and creativity charts.

At the back Ryan Tafazolli and Joe Low have forged a regular partnership with Bristol City Ioanee Low having three goals of his own to his name and acting as an aerial presence in both boxes.

In 2021, a group of passionate women fans felt mobilised to start a campaign called #HerGameToo.

The campaign is committed to fostering an ethos in football where women are welcomed and respected equally and can be confident sharing their opinions about football online and in person without fear of sexist abuse. This afternoon, we introduce two new advocates to the cause.

Cheltenham Town's Her Game Too ambassador, Kelly-Marie Selby, tells us: "Growing up loving football, it was so sad that not only did girls not have the opportunities that boys had to further their abilities, but trying to voice my opinion was almost impossible. As soon as I tried to express any views I was told I was a girl, I didn't know anything about football, and I should just concentrate on make up and being a girl.

"The younger me shied away from fighting, but as I got older, I knew this wasn't right and that I should be allowed to join in on conversations about football. So when the opportunity came to become an ambassador of an amazing campaign to empower women to have a voice without fear, I put myself forward.

Over the past few months I've been ambassador for Her Game Too
Cheltenham, and this has now grown

with three incredible ladies coming on board - Mary Stone, Taz Scoles and Emily Moore.

"Together, we want to help create an environment at The Completely-Suzuki Stadium where women of all ages can feel welcome and safe without fear of sexism and misogyny, knowing there are avenues to report such incidents."

Introducing themselves,

Taz explained: "53 years ago the ban of woman playing football was finally lifted, and now we are seeing woman on the big screens influencing the new generation. Her Game Too brings awareness to the struggles woman players and fans may face and how we can eliminate it. I am so excited to work alongside Her Game Too to raise more awareness and inspire the younger generations."

Alongside Taz and Kelly-Marie, Mary reflected on what the campaign is for her: "Her Game Too means being able to go and watch football games wherever I want, whenever I want,



without being made uncomfortable. In the short space of time I've been involved with this group, I've connected with so many female football friends, like Kelly and Taz, and sharing our experiences together shows exactly why we're doing what we're doing.

"I'd encourage everyone to find a way to get involved with Her Game Too, it could be through doing something so simple as wearing our badge or taking a more front facing role in tackling sexism in football."
