



INTRODUCING DARRELL CLARKE



Last week, Darrell Clarke was announced as the new Cheltenham Town manager replacing Wade Elliott after 15 months in charge.

The 45-year-old watched the Robins' 2-0 defeat to Lincoln City in person ahead of officially taking over on Monday ahead of the game against Fleetwood Town.

"It's a club with a great history, they've had some good managers over the years and I'm really looking forward to the challenge," said Clarke speaking to the club channels on Monday morning.

Clarke has enjoyed a successful career in the game both as a player which spanned 18 years and then since as a manager where he has won promotions with Salisbury Town, Bristol Rovers and most recently Port Vale.

"It's always a club that I've thought has been a well-run football club in the past. I looked at it and put my CV in, obviously with plenty of games I've managed now, plenty of experience and I thought it's a job that I could make a difference in."

The Robins wouldn't find themselves in their current position without the work of Michael Duff and Elliott and the new manager was quick to recognise those feats.

"Credit to the work Michael Duff and Wade Elliott have done over the last few years and it has certainly been a well-run football club that has achieved success in getting promoted from League Two to League One."

There are a few recognisable faces around the club having previously worked with George Lloyd and Liam Sercombe and they will know first



hand the demands Clarke has in store for the players.

"Giving everything and that isn't just on a Saturday at three o'clock but throughout the week, the training plan, what they eat, how they live their lives and how they respond to what I want from them.

The former midfielder has arrived with the club in the midst of a poor run of form but the events of the season so far aren't fazing him and his bullish approach

"I can't change the past. The only thing I can do is try and change the future. That's why I'm in the building to look at all aspects of the football club to get us back to positive results and positive performances.

"I will be assessing everything over the coming weeks and months to try and make sure we are moving in the right direction.

"It's going to take time. I'm not stupid enough to think that a team that hasn't scored a goal or won for 10 games isn't going to take time.

"I'm hoping to make a massive difference and I believe at every club I've managed I've put them in a better place and I will be looking to do the same with Cheltenham

The journey starts with three successive home games within seven days and Clarke wants to leave an early impression on the Inval Robins fanbase.

"The message is for us to get winning games. The only way you please fans up and down the country at different clubs is by winning football matches."

CHAIRMAN DAVID BLOXHAM

I would like to welcome the directors, players, staff and fans of Derby County to the Completely-Suzuki Stadium for this afternoon's League One fixture.

As we all know Derby are a big club with a rich history and large fanbase I am sure that all Rams fans and probably many neutral observers would expect the club's ambition to be playing in the Championship and ultimately the Premier League.

By contrast many people within football consider that Cheltenham Town's status as a League One club exceeds an objective analysis of where the club might reasonably expect to be having regard to the size of its regular fanbase and resources. If I were given a pound for every time someone tells me, we are "punching above our weight" I would be rich.

I am acutely aware of the club's current league position and form and of the resulting unhappiness of many fans. I am a very long-standing fan of the club and am as unhappy with our current position as any other fan.

I often hear or read that the board of the club "has no ambition" and/or "no plan". I do not accept that either of these opinions are correct.

Speaking personally as a board member I was asked to join the board at a point in our recent history when we had just been relegated into the National League. If, at that time, fans had been offered the opportunity of an immediate return to League Two and, within a period of seven years, to have achieved two promotions and enjoyed its two highest ever finishes in the third tier, it would have been gratefully accepted. That is the position that we find ourselves in today.



I acknowledge our current league position is a huge disappointment and accept some collective responsibility for that. It is always possible, with the benefit of hindsight, to suggest that certain things could have been done differently. With hindsight some things may have been done differently. Sport however is not a finite science. There are many unpredictables and "twists and turns"

We must face the reality that we are a League One club aspiring to improve our league position and status year on year on what essentially Is a League Two budget.

We should not forget that since our year in the National League our playing budget has increased year on year. Over the last three years it has increased by more than a third. The club has also made significant investment in the future by its purchase of the training ground and other essential improvements to the infrastructure. Our academy has several promising players developing. There is no lack of

ambition to grow the club and aim for a higher league.

I know our current position is extremely disappointing but I and all members of the board together with the club staff, manager and players are doing our utmost to change our fortunes on the pitch. In this regard you will all be aware of the board's recent appointment of Darrell Clarke as our new manager. Darrell's appointment has, I believe been well received and is in my view an excellent appointment for our club. Darrell will need time to achieve improvement. I know it can be difficult when things are not going well but I do urge fans to continue to support the club through this extremely difficult period in our League One history. We are at an entirely different and higher level to where we were only eight years ago at which time, we would have welcomed a league fixture against Derby County. Please keep the faith and support the team as you always do.

Nathan Butler-Oyedeji, the boy from Hale End looking to leave his mark on Whaddon Road, is settling into his new surroundings at Cheltenham Town.

The 20-year-old striker arrived at the club ahead of his first full loan spell, after being with Premier League side Arsenal since 2011.

"I feel good, I am happy to be here and ready for the challenge ahead," said Butler-Oyedeji.

He got to experience his first taste of first team football earlier in the year with Accrington Stanley, an important experience he reflects on fondly.

"Coming from Arsenal it was a bit of a culture shock but one every player needs. I think I've come out better for it and I'm ready to transfer the lessons I learnt from that loan into this opportunity.

"There were certain things that you don't really get in under-21 football that I found out towards the end of last season. Hopefully that has prepared me for this loan to help me do well for Cheltenham."

The London-born footballer earned the chance to train with Mikel Arteta and the first team at Arsenal, just weeks before arriving at the Completely-Suzuki Stadium.

It's a club that Nathan holds close to his heart, with every moment he spends at the club described as a privilege.

"There's been ups and downs as there is with anything but for the most part it's been very good. It's one of the biggest clubs in the world and it's been a privilege to play for them.

"When you first go over to the first team, you see people you idolise but when you get comfortable you understand the rhythm and becoming accustomed to it and how they play."

Highly rated by those back at his parent club, he brings a skillset that can pack a punch at League One level, and he has already demonstrated so in flashes for the Robins.

"Some would say I'm quite fast with my pace, I can make things happen and I've got an eye for a goal and can create a goal."



DERBY COUNTY



Derby County remain unfamiliar faces in the third tier of English football after the 2022/23 season marked their first at this level since 1986. After narrowly missing out on the play-offs last term, Paul Warne and co are determined to right those wrongs.

A 1-1 draw with Portsmouth on the final day of last season condemned Derby to a seventh-place finish and cut short an instant return to the Championship. But 10 games into the new season the goal is the same for Warne and his side.

Rams fans will be hoping Martyn Waghorn can play a big part in that after his return to Pride Park over the Summer. Joining him in the off-season were several defensive reinforcements including full backs Callum Elder and Kane Wilson as well as central defender Curtis Nelson.

At the other end of the pitch, the experienced Connor Washington made the move from Warne's old club Rotherham United with fellow striker Tyreece John-Jules ioining from Arsenal's academy. Those names help bolster the already impressive ranks that feature the exciting Nathaniel Mendez-Laing as well as the duo of Conor Hourihane and Korey Smith in the midfield.

Despite losing 25-goal star David McGoldrick, stalwart defender Curtis Davies to the Robins as well as Krystian Bielik and Jason Knight, the club are once again in the hunt for promotion. The Rams occupy seventh spot in League One after the opening 10 games. They arrive at the Completely-Suzuki Stadium on the back of a midweek 3-1 win over Blackpool and are in the midst of

The Robins fell to a 3-2 defeat to today's opponents at the Completely-Suzuki Stadium in Sky Bet League One action the last time the two sides met in Gloucestershire.

Goals from former Robins Caleb Taylor and Alfie May proved not to be enough for Cheltenham as the visitors went back to Pride Park with all three points.

The Robins took an early lead in the tie as Liam Sercombe played an inviting ball into the box which was headed home by Taylor who scored his first goal of the season.

Derby didn't hang about in levelling the scores however, drawing level just five minutes later through a headed finish from Conor Hourihane.

Max Bird would add another just after the tenth minute to put the visitors in front, rifling

a thunderous left-footed effort past Luke Southwood from some way out.

Just after half-time and Derby would add another to put the visitors in real control. Tom Barkhuizen beat his man before coolly slotting past Southwood in front of the travelling away fans.

A second goal would come for the Robins through May, as goal-scorer of the opener Taylor nodded the ball down from a Taylor Perry free-kick to bring Cheltenham within one goal.

But Town just couldn't force an all-important equaliser, meaning it was the Rams who walked away victorious at full-time.


