# CHAIRMAN DAVID BLOXHAM

**A very warm welcome to the directors, staff, players and fans of Oxford United who have made the relatively short journey along the A40 for this afternoon's League One fixture.**

The U's have made an impressive start to the current season lying second in the league as we go into this afternoon's fixture. I know that Darrell and the players will know they will be facing a very tough game but will go into the match encouraged by our recently improved form.

This season has seen us miss some Saturday fixtures due to international breaks which has disrupted the normal Saturday fixture routine of the season. Whilst breaking momentum, I think it will have provided our management staff with an opportunity to do extra work with the players and has also enabled players to recover from knocks and bruises they may have been carrying.

Although we have not had a competitive first team game since 11th November there has been a lot of work done in the interim period both on and off the pitch.

In terms of off-field work there is always an immense amount of administration to be done in running a League One football club. On Friday 10th November the directors had a strategy away day to take stock of the club's current plans and projects going forward for the future. All directors attended together with a facilitator who chaired the meeting and drew out many useful thoughts and ideas from those present. The meeting was a success and a very worthwhile exercise. We concluded upon the basis that we will all undertake certain tasks

with a further meeting planned for January 2024 to finalise our plans and vision for the club in both the short, medium and longer term.

On Thursday of last week, I, together with two other directors attended one of the quarterly trustee meetings of the Cheltenham Town Community Trust. The Trust is a registered charity and does an enormous amount of excellent work within local schools and the wider community. It is an extremely well-run organisation with some great staff and knowledgeable trustees. Moving forward it will be the aim of both the Community Trust and the football club to further increase a crossover of initiatives and working practices for the benefit of the Trust and the Club as a whole.

This week some board members have met to review and update various crucial policy documents such as our safeguarding and health & safety policies and to finalise the documentation and implementation of the EFL code of practice for equality, diversity, and inclusion. The process of updating these policies creates a significant amount of administrative work as EFL and FA policies do tend to require a "one size fits all" approach which is applied to the larger Championship clubs as they are applied to clubs further down the EFL structure.

On Thursday we had a Robins Trust meeting and fans forum at Deya Brewery which I attended alongside both Darrell and Adam, which was followed by our monthly board meeting yesterday prior to today's fixture.

There is always a good deal to do to ensure that the club runs as smoothly as possible and is fully compliant in all required respects.

In the absence of a competitive first team game last Saturday, I went to watch the club's first year pro Adulai Sambu who is currently on loan at Hungerford Town. Adulai is doing well at Hungerford playing regularly and chipping in with a good number of goals and assists. Hungerford ran out 2-0 winners against Truro City.

On Tuesday many of you would have seen that our under 18's played in the second round of the FA Youth Cup comfortably beating Dorking Wanderers 3-0 with a brace of goals from Tom King and a well struck effort by skipper Brandon Liggett. It was great to see the academy boys playing so well and with the win their reward is a third-round tie against Premier League Sheffield United.

The academy is very well run by Tim Bell and his staff and has a number of very promising youngsters within its various age groups.

Returning to the subject of the first team I should like to end by thanking Darrell, Adam Murray, James Bittner and Ashley Vincent together with all the other support staff for the work they are doing which has resulted in our recently improved performances. We face a tough challenge over the rest of the season but by working hard and sticking together we can give ourselves a chance of retaining our League One status. Your support is vital to the team and our prospects of success. I ask you all to continue to provide your magnificent support at every game which I know will be a vital ingredient to us improving our league position.

Enjoy the game.

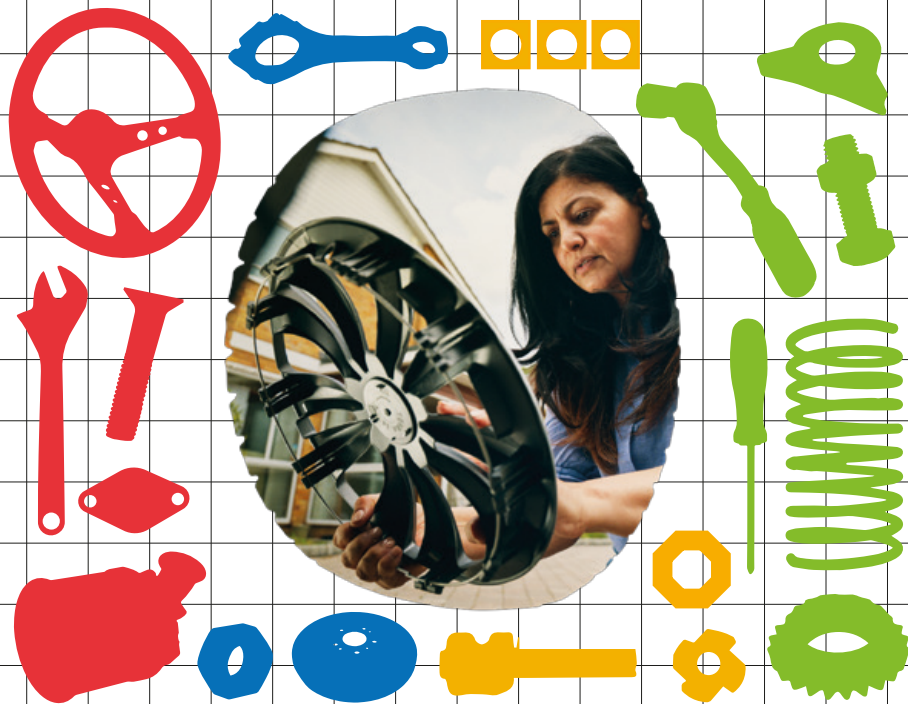

**Cinderford Town U12s** currently compete in **Division One of the Cheltenham League.**

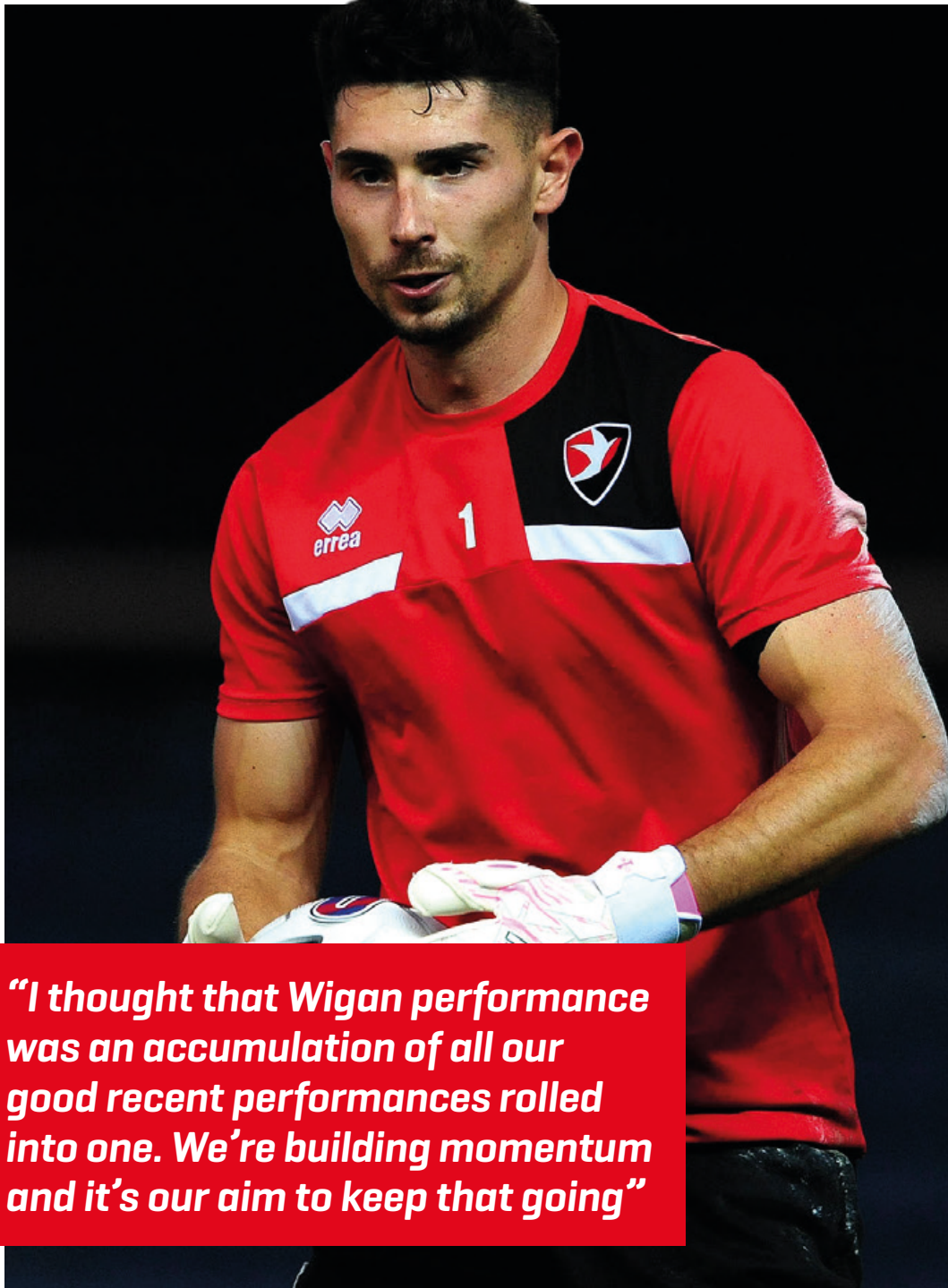

# LUKE SOUTHWOOD

After establishing himself as a firm fans favourite during his loan spell last season, Luke Southwood is keen to push on further with Cheltenham Town this term.

The Robins goalkeeper returned to the club permanently in the summer, ending his long-standing affiliation with Reading who he began his career with as a youngster.

“I was absolutely buzzing to finally get it done,” admitted Southwood.

“It is something that I wanted throughout the Summer window and I was delighted to get back here and get going again.”

The Northern Ireland international kept 16 clean sheets under last season and is eager to replicate that feat and push on further with the Robins during the 23/24 campaign.

“I want to keep improving and getting better. Obviously it was amazing what we managed to do as a team last year.

“It’s a different challenge for us this time around, but our aim is still to keep improving and get ourselves out of this battle we’re currently in.”

The 25-year-old’s relationship with key figures from last season played a role in his return, with one in particular being singled out by the shot stopper.

“There’s obviously James Bittner the goalkeeping coach who played a massive part.

“I work really well with him and have done since my time with Reading. He’s a big part of me improving and getting to where I am.”

The goalkeeper also revealed his enthusiasm for joining back up with a group of players he only has glowing praise for, a similar praise he places on the Robins faithful

“It was such a good group last year and it’s been no different this time around. The new lads just add to that.

“As for the fans, when you feel support like that, you see it, get messages and stuff like that, it’s what you want as a footballer and a person in general.

“They were a massive factor in my decision to return as well and it’s been great to get back playing in front of them again.”

Southwood was the hero in the Robins last league game at the Completely-Suzuki Stadium when his penalty save to deny Stephen Humphrys helped Town to a valuable point.

There’s no denying it’s been an unprecedented start to the new campaign, but the Robins fortunes appear to be on the up, with the testing goal of survival in the sights of Darrell Clarke’s squad.

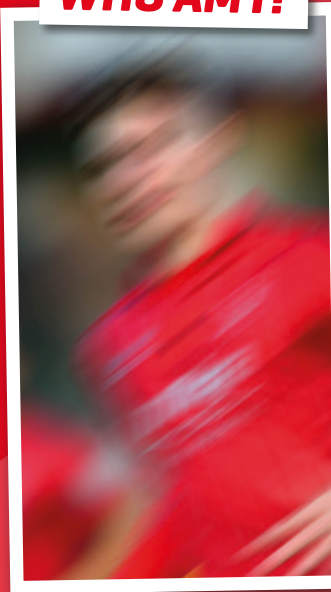

**After a disappointing 2022/23 campaign, Oxford United are returning to their heights of years gone by with promotion the goal for the U's squad and recently appointed manager Des Buckingham.**

A 19th place finish in League One last season came as a shock to many after three consecutive finishes within the top eight of the third tier. In the midst of that, Liam Manning arrived as manager in March to first help steady the ship and keep the U's safe before inspiring a turnaround this term.

That revival has them sat in second after 16 games, but their good form came at a cost, which saw Manning move on to pastures new, departing the Kassam Stadium for the west country with Championship outfit Bristol City.

Enter Des Buckingham, the lifelong Oxford fan who arrived from Mumbai City in the last week, inheriting a squad that is on top form with only a point between them and Portsmouth at the top of the table.

A 3-2 win over Leyton Orient days before his arrival maintained an unbeaten run that has stretched to five games in all competitions after their league defeat to Wigan Athletic back in late October.

Amongst the U's ranks is a regular at this level in Billy Bodin, who has rediscovered his best goalscoring form with six goals to his name already

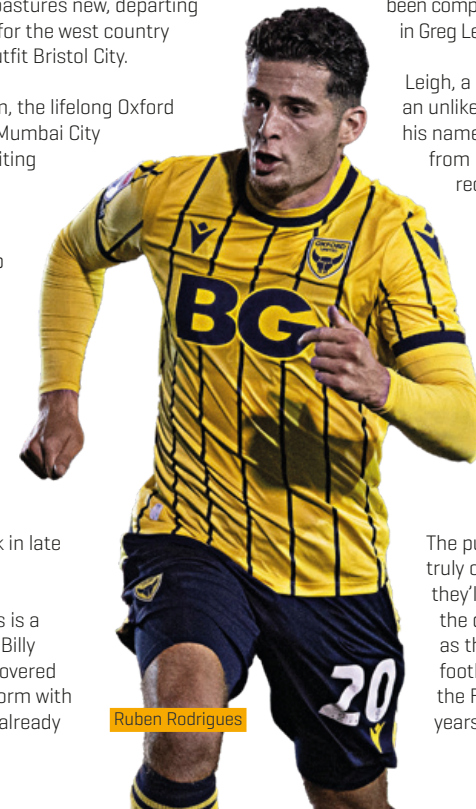
this season. Alongside him is fellow forward and new recruit Mark Harris who also has six goals in all competitions, after his Summer move from Cardiff City.

Elsewhere, the beating heart of the U's Cameron Brannagan has continued his impressive form of past seasons with eight goal contributions to his name. The midfielder, now in his fifth year at the club, has been complemented by other new signings in Greg Leigh and Ruben Rodrigues.

Leigh, a left back from Ipswich, has been an unlikely source of goals with five to his name whilst Rodrigues, who arrived from Notts County, scored twice in the recent win over Orient.

The current squad have fond memories of playing at the Completely-Suzuki Stadium after a 2-1-win last season in an eventful game that saw both sides have a man sent off. They would back that up with a 4-0 win at the Kassam later on in the campaign, completing the double.

The push for promotion is well and truly on this term for United, and they'll be hoping their new man in the dugout can keep them on track as they continue their rise up the football pyramid after their return to the Football League a little over 13 years ago.

## ROBINS 1-0 OXFORD



**The Robins secured a comfortable 1-0 win over today's opponents at the Completely-Suzuki Stadium in Sky Bet League One action when the two met back in 2021.**



A second half goal from talisman Alife May was enough to earn all three points for Michael Duff's Robins who continued to enjoy their return to the third tier.

The early pressure came from the hosts with then Wolves loanee Taylor Perry firing a warning shot wide of Jack Stevens' goal.

This woke the visitors up and James Henry twice brought Scott Flinders into action, forcing a routine save before the Robins goalkeeper made an excellent diving save with the ball seemingly destined for the top corner.

Half-time came and went for the visitors without another

chance of note before the hosts struck the killer blow not long after the hour mark.

Quick thinking from Flinders saw him release Kyle Joseph, who was able to get in behind the U's defence before squaring to his strike partner May for a simple tap in.

A response from the visitors never came and despite chances for the Robins to double their lead, they were able to pick up the three points, seeing out a comfortable one goal victory.

The win was the club's third of the league season and the Robins' first consecutive wins since being promoted to back League One.

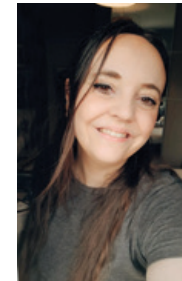

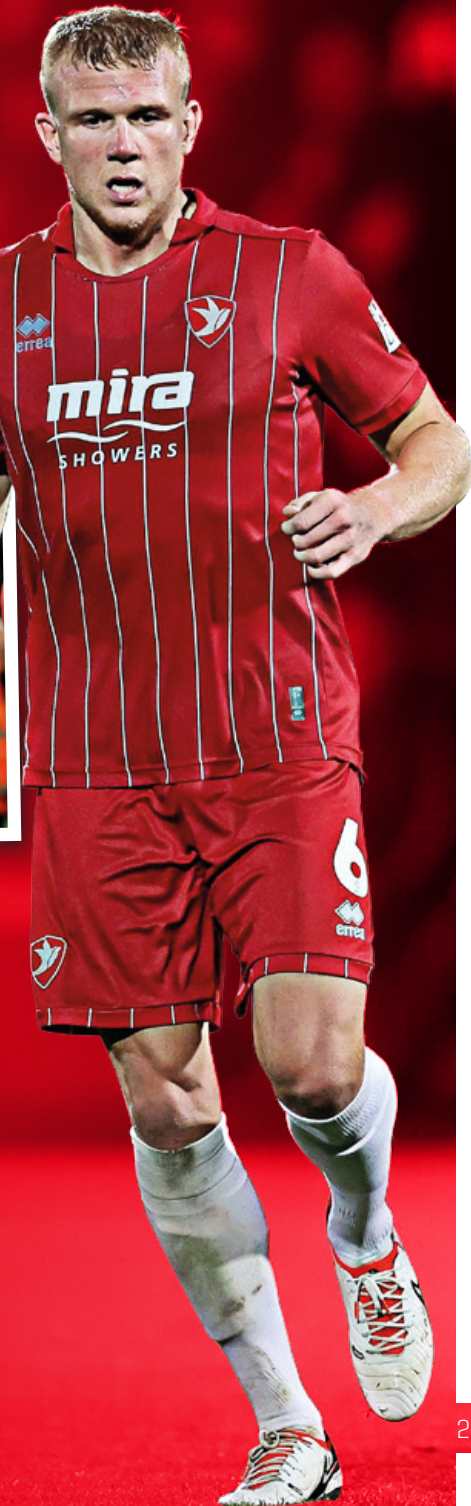
